

QUESTIONNAIRE FOR INFORMATION REQUIRED BY COMMISSION FOR AGRICULTURAL COSTS AND PRICES FOR ITS REPORT ON PRICE POLICY FOR KHARIF CROPS OF 2010-2011 SEASON.

(Though the Kharif Report will cover mainly the following crops: (i) *Cereals*: paddy, jowar, bajra, maize, ragi; (ii) *Pulses*: tur (arhar), moong, urad; (iii) *Oilseeds*: groundnut, soyabean, sunflowerseed, sesamum, nigerseed; (iv) *Cotton*; (v) *VFC tobacco*, yet the Commission is interested in all facts, issues, suggestions relating to the State's agricultural sector as a whole. Therefore, replies to the questionnaire may cover discussions on various issues and additional information on other crops grown in the State.)
